



## When to go

The climate of Argentina ranges from the great heat and extensive rains of the subtropical north, through to the pleasant climate of the central Pampas and the sub-Antarctic cold of the Patagonian Sea in the south. The main central area is temperate, but can be hot and humid during summer (December to February) and cool in winter. Head to Buenos Aires in September-November and February-March to enjoy warm weather while avoiding the stifling heat.

# Argentina

From the glaciers of Patagonia to the tango halls of Buenos Aires, Argentina is a land of stunning landscapes and friendly people. Argentina has a long, colourful history of indigenous, Criollo and European influences that have blended to form the unique identity it enjoys today. One of the most popular destinations in Latin America, Argentina boasts a level of culture and sophistication that complement its natural beauty.

Begin in the vibrant Buenos Aires and visit the city's most evocative neighbourhoods, filled with elegant architecture, historic attractions, excellent museums and other highlights as well as taking advantage of the exciting contemporary art and design scene, world-class restaurants and great shopping. Browse lively markets, wander the cobbled backstreets and enjoy a tango performance at an intimate, upscale dinner theatre.

Journey to Patagonia, the 'End of the World'. This is the gateway to the Antarctic, where the oceans meet and the winds blow furiously. Numerous islands, channels, icebergs, forests, lakes and a large variety of flora and fauna allow you to enjoy one of life's truly unique experiences. This is also home to the southernmost city in the world. Ushuaia is located at the end of a bay which opens onto the Beagle Channel and probably the two most important full-day excursions in Ushuaia are the visit to the Tierra del Fuego National Park, South America's largest island, and the chance to sail through the Beagle Channel with its many unique seabirds, seals and the elegant Magellanic Penguins.

Travel onwards to El Calafate, one of the most beautiful places in Patagonia and the gateway to the Los Glaciares National Park - The layout of this wild and difficult terrain makes it one of the

most unusual national parks in the world. It forms part of the Patagonia Continental Ice Field from which 13 glaciers descended on the Atlantic side and flow into the Viedma and Argentino lakes. The Perito Moreno glacier, one of the few remaining advancing glaciers in the world, offers an overwhelming sight each time its towers of ice break into multiple icebergs. This park has been declared a part of the Natural Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO and consists of glaciers formed by the compaction of snow and ice which slowly slide down from the peaks of the Andes. The best time to visit the area is summer. It is an unforgettable experience, sailing between icebergs on the Argentino Lake. You can also choose between other exciting experiences such as sailing on the lake at night or trekking over Moreno Glacier.

Finally, visit Iguazu Falls, one of the most breathtaking natural attractions in the world. There are nearly 3km of waterfalls at Iguazu Falls. This National Park is home to more the 2,100 plant species and 400 bird species. The waters, flowing over the 275 different falls, descend from a height of 214ft and stun you with their power and beauty. Explore hundreds of waterfalls streaming over the high cliffs, travel through the jungle on an open train as butterflies flit about, or you may like to take a cruise up the Iguazu River for an unforgettable experience as you feel the force of the Iguazu Falls from below.
